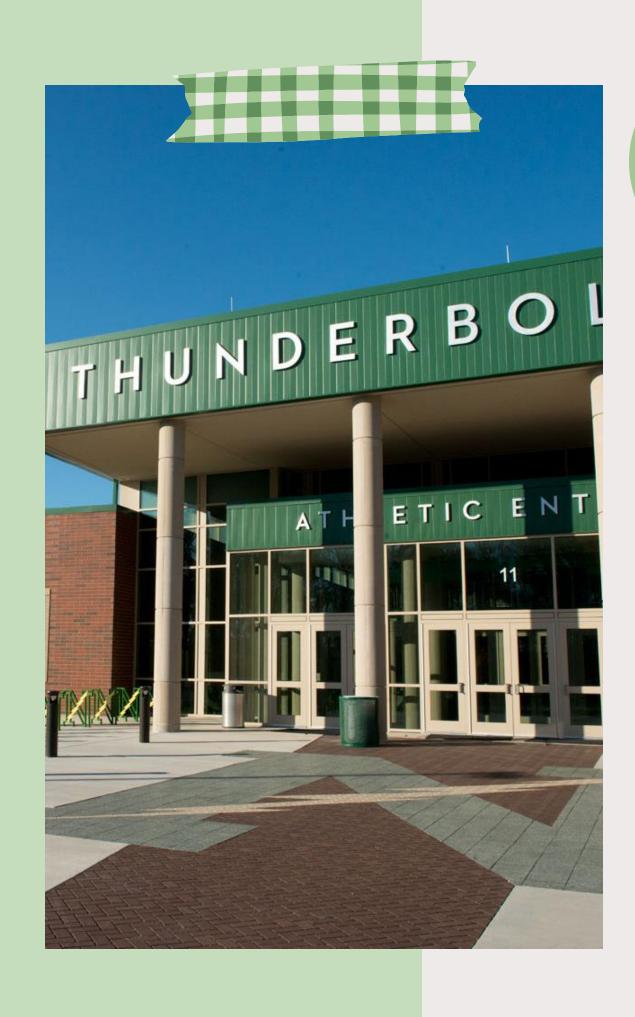

- from rural to the edge of urban
 - All students attend a PK-1 building

Started with the MTSS process

Our middle school has three 7th grade teams and three 8th grade teams

Our school day includes a 20 minute daily advisory time.

Our district has used FastBridge to benchmark students for the past six years.

MTSS AT NMS **LEAD: SCHOOL PSYCH** Responsible for coordinating building communication and facilitating the BDT. Acts as the point person for the building with the district MTSS leadership team. **BUILDING LEADERSHIP TEAM** Members: Administration, counseling staff, curriculum Responsible for setting expectations for building MTSS process, creating the schedule of interventions and meetings, training staff on intervention programs, and reviewing decision rules

MTSS TEAM LEADS

Members: Team Leaders, block teachers, TBolt intervention providers, and SEL lead.

Responsible for communicating MTSS expectations to team, leading TBTs, ensuring spreadsheets are current
