# OHIO SEAL OF BILITERACY



## APPROVED WORLD (FOREIGN) LANGUAGE ASSESSMENTS ALIGNED TO ACTFL PROFICIENCY GUIDELINES 2024

The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce has reviewed and approved the following list of assessments for use in determining world (foreign) language eligibility for the [Ohio Seal of Biliteracy](#). The minimum qualifying score equivalent to the **required Intermediate High level of proficiency** is provided for each assessment on the list. The criteria used for determining appropriate vendor assessments for the Ohio Seal of Biliteracy are:

- The assessments must be either performance- or proficiency-based.
- The assessments must test the language skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- The Department may make exceptions for performance- or proficiency-based assessments of less commonly taught languages that may not test all four language skills.
- American Sign Language assessments must cover receptive and expressive skills.
- Classical language assessments must minimally assess performance or proficiency in reading.
- Assessment scoring must demonstrate clear alignment with the ACTFL [2024 Proficiency Guidelines](#).
- The assessments must have sufficient item coverage from Novice Mid to Advanced proficiency or performance levels aligned to the ACTFL 2024 Proficiency Guidelines.
- International assessment scoring aligned to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) does meet the requirement of alignment with the 2024 ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines.
- Assessments that focus primarily on testing discrete grammar and vocabulary knowledge or skills **are not** approved measurements of performance or proficiency for the Ohio Seal of Biliteracy.
- Seals of Biliteracy offered by external vendors cannot be substituted for the Ohio Seal of Biliteracy.

*A Request for Quotations (RFQ) process will be used to add new world (foreign) language assessments from vendors.*
