Ohio Department

The superintendent of public instruction shall establish a gifted advisory council. The council shall:

1. Represent a variety of stakeholders from diverse regions of the state, including parents, general and gifted educators, administrators another as determined by the superintendent;

2. Assist in the development and updating of a department approved plan for gifted education in Ohio:

3. Advise on policy recommendations;



4. Serve as advisors in establishing criteria for review of proposals to implement innovative gifted services; and

5. Establish criteria for identifying and recognizing schools, districts, and other educational providers



Students Identified in Math, Percentage at Advanced or Advanced Plus on 3rd Grade Math 2016-17 Ohio State Test




Students Identified in Superior Cognitive or Specific Academic, Grades K-3




Identified Students who Receive Services in Superior Cognitive or Specific Academic, Grades K-3







Distribution of Districts by Economic Disadvantage and K-3 Identification in Superior Cognitive Ability or Specific Academic Ability





Innovative Gifted Services Proposal

The *department* shall establish a process and criteria for submission and review of proposals related to the innovative design and delivery of services for students who are gifted. Innovative gifted service proposals may be approved for not more than 5 years of implementation.



Innovative Gifted Services Proposal

Gifted Advisory Council

Serve as advisors in establishing *criteria* for review of proposals to implement innovative gifted services.
