		For transfer students, previous language survey data and English learner records were requested.

2.		<b>reen.</b> Students born outside of the United States <b>or</b> with languages other than English the Language Usage Survey take the Ohio English Language Proficiency Screener.

3.	se	<b>ptify.</b> If a student is identified as an English learner the parent must be notified of rvices within 30 days of enrollment. If the student enrolls mid-year the parent must be stified within two weeks of placement into an English language development program.

Schools may better understand the student's linguistic experience and educational background with questions related to these areas that impact instruction.

#### A. Language and Literacy Background

- What is your child's first or primary language?
- Does your child understand and speak a language other than English?
- Does your child read and write in a language other than English?
- Does your child "mix" languages? Describe.
- What language do you use most frequently with your child?
- What other language(s) do you use with your child?
- What other language(s) does your child understand or use?

#### B. Prior Education

- Has your child ever been identified by a school as an English learner?
- Where has your child attended schools in the U.S. or other countries?
- Do you have previous school records?
- How long has your child been in U.S. schools?
- In what languages has your child received instruction?
- Did your child attend school before kindergarten?
- Does your student have an individualized education program (IEP) or 504 plan?

### C. Interrupted Formal Education and Attendance

- Was there a period of time when your child did not consistently attend school?
- Before coming to the U.S., was your child separated from other family members?
