## 2023-2024 National School Lunch Program Equipment Assistance Grant Application 2023-2024 National School Lunch Program Equipment Assistance Grant Terms and Conditions

#### Purpose of 2023-2024 Equipment Assistance Grant Funding:

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, provided \$30 million to the USDA Food and Nutrition Service for the purpose of equipment assistance grants. The Ohio Department of Education, Office of Nutrition (ON) received \$855,230 for distribution to eligible school food authorities participating in the National School Lunch Program.

These funds will make a significant investment in meeting the unmet need allowing the purchase of capital equipment needed to serve healthier meals, improve food safety, and to help support the establishment, maintenance, or expansion of the School Breakfast Program.

Funds may be used for new equipment purchases (i.e. purchases that occur after the school is awarded funds), renovation of equipment or replacement of equipment. The funds may not be used to retroactively pay for or reimburse the school for prior equipment purchases.

#### **Application Process**

Eligible School Food Authorities must complete an electronic application by 12:00 a.m., November 30, 2023. No paper applications will be accepted. All submissions are subject to clarification or collection of additional information.

#### **Application Review Method:**

- 1. All Ohio schools operating the National School Lunch Program may apply for the **2023-2024** Equipment Assistance Grant.
- 2. To be considered for the **2023-2024** Equipment Assistance Grant, School Food Authorities should address the following equipment grant criteria in their application:
  - Age of food service equipment or lack of appropriate items
  - The availability of existing State and local funding for equipment purchases
  - Strategies for adopting lunchroom changes that provide more convenience and appeal to the student
  - Opportunities to realize meaningful impacts on nutrition and quality of meals
- 3. Priority will be given to schools who are showing a negative fund balance and who have not received any previous years equipment grant awards.
- 4. If there are any remaining funds from the equipment grant award, then priority will next be given to those schools which had received previous year's award's starting with inception year 2009 and then proceeding forward.

#### **Important Dates:**

November 8, 2023: Application opens

December 8, 2023: Application closes at 11:59 pm EST

January 8, 2024 (tentative): Applicants notified of awards

After reviewing applications, award recipients will be notified by ODE Fiscal Management. General announcement of awards will be made after acceptance of awards is received.

# Definition of Equipment for the Purposes of the 2023 National School Lunch Program Equipment Assistance Grant:

State agencies competitively award subgrants to local educational agencies and schools to purchase equipment, with a value of greater than \$1,000, needed to serve healthier meals, improve food safety, and to help support the establishment, maintenance, or expansion of the School Breakfast Program.

#### General Terms and Conditions for Equipment Funding and Purchase:

- 1. A signed Assurance Statement in relation to the Equipment Grant award will be submitted to the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce prior to the procurement of the equipment.
- 2. The procurement in relation to this award must comply with local, state, and federal procurement laws and regulations. Ensure that all procurement for new equipment is conducted in a manner that provides, to the maximum extent possible, open, and free competition.
- 3. Funds must be used for new equipment purchases (i.e. purchases that occur after the school is awarded funds). The funds may not be used to retroactively pay for or reimburse the school for prior equipment purchases.
- 4. Unexpended funds of the approved grant will be refunded to ISS for further award to eligible applicants.
- 5. Equipment purchased under this program will not be given to, granted to, transferred to, leased to, or sold to any person or entity that is not eligible to participate in the grant program as applicant.
- 6. School Food Authorities selected to receive proceeds of this grant will be required to provide the following documentation upon expenditure and request for reimbursement.
  - Invoices detailing item(s) purchased (including shipping & handling, any installation charges, and date of delivery/install)
  - Date equipment was installed and used toward meeting grant initiatives.
  - Copies of payment to the vendor(s) or financial reports detailing that funds were disbursed
- 7. School Food Authorities must abide by the grant timeline or risk forfeiture or repayment of grant funds.
- 8. School Food Authorities shall retain grant files and supporting documentation for a term of three (3) years after final payment. School Food Authorities will make these files available for review by the USDA or ON upon request.

If there are any violations of this assurance, the Department of Agriculture, FNS, shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance. This assurance is binding on the Grantee, its successors, transferees and assignees as long as it receives assistance or retains possession of any assistance from USDA.
