

Paths to Obtain an Ohio Career-Technical Teacher License


Teacher Recruitment to Five-Year Professional License

Three Career-Technical Licensure Routes

According to the Teacher Licensure Standards, career-technical licenses can be obtained in three paths: Resident Educator based on Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3301-24-18, effective 1/29/11; Alternative Resident Educator License, OAC rule 3301-24-22, effective 2/14/11; and Supplemental license, OAC Rule 3301-24-14 effective 7/24/11.


Renewal and Advancement of Five-Year Professional License

Resident Educator (RE)




Resident Educator
The Career-Technical Resident Educator license (OAC 3301-24-18) may be obtained by an individual who holds the baccalaureate degree, who has successfully completed an Approved Program of Preparation, who has successfully completed examinations prescribed by the State Board of Education, and has two years full-time, documented work experience. Career-technical licenses shall be issued for specific programs or taxonomies in the following teaching fields: Agriculture, Integrated Business, Family and Consumer Sciences and Marketing and Technology Education.

Alternative Resident Educator for Career-Technical Workforce Development Programs (A-RE)



Alternative Resident Educator
The Alternative Resident Educator License for Career-Technical Workforce Development Programs (OAC 3301-24-22) may be obtained by an individual who holds a minimum of a high school diploma; who evidences five years of full-time work experience or the equivalent in the career field. License shall be issued for specific programs or taxonomies in the following occupational fields even though the baccalaureate degree is not held: Agriculture and Environmental Systems, Arts and Communication, Business and Administrative Services, Construction Technologies, Education and Training, Engineering and Science Technologies, Finance, Government and Public Administration, Health Science, Hospitality and Tourism, Human Services, Information Technology, Law and Public Safety, Manufacturing Technologies, Marketing, and Transportation Systems.

Supplemental License for Career-Technical Workforce Development Programs (S)



Supplemental
The Supplemental License for Career-Technical Workforce Development Programs (OAC 3301-24-14) may be obtained by an individual who holds a standard teaching license; who evidences five years of full-time work experience or the equivalent in the career field; and who completes a minimum of three semester hours of an approved preservice career-technical education program. Upon completion of the approved preparation program and recommendation by the dean or head of teacher education at an institution approved to prepare Career-Technical Workforce Development teachers, a professional license shall be issued for specific programs or taxonomies in the following occupational fields: Agriculture and Environmental Systems, Arts and Communication, Business and Administrative Services, Construction Technologies, Education and Training, Engineering and Science Technologies, Finance, Government and Public Administration, Health Science, Hospitality and Tourism, Human Services, Information Technology, Law and Public Safety, Manufacturing Technologies, Marketing, and Transportation Systems.

OPTIONAL LICENSE LEVELS

Senior Professional Educator License (ORC 3319.22, OAC 3301-24-16)
Valid for five years
Renewable
Master's degree from a regionally accredited institute of higher education

Nine years of experience under a standard teaching license or certificate, of which at least five years are under a professional/ permanent license/ certificate; and

Demonstration of effective practice at the accomplished or distinguished level of performance as defined in the Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession, specifically by successful completion of the Master Teacher portfolio.

Lead Professional Educator (Five Year) License (ORC 3319.22, OAC 3301-24-17)
Valid for five years
Renewable
Master's degree from a regionally accredited institute of higher education

Nine years under a standard teaching license or certificate, of which at least five years are under a professional/permanent license/certificate or senior professional educator license; and

Demonstration of effective practice at the distinguished level of performance defined in the Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession specifically, by holding active National Board Certification or successful completion of the Master Teacher portfolio and the Teacher Leader Endorsement.
