


OVERALL RESULTS


- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Ohio was 260. This was higher than the average score of 257 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Ohio in 2024 (260) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (262) and was lower than their average score in 2002 (268).
- The percentage of students in Ohio who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 32 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (33 percent) and in 2002 (35 percent).
- The percentage of students in Ohio who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 69 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (71 percent) and was smaller than that in 2002 (82 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (27 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, male students in Ohio had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 11 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (16 points).
