<b>Testing</b>	Students must meet the graduation requirements from the time of entry in ninth grade (earn required number of credits; pass proficiency/Ohio Graduation Tests, unless exempted from testing)	Students must pass WorkKeys tests and earn a composite score of 14 over three tests. Students do not need to pass the proficiency/Ohio Graduation Tests	Approved Ohio testing vendors — GED and HiSET — are located throughout the state. Test-takers must pass all vendor subtests. Scores do not merge between vendors	Students must meet the graduation requirements from the time of entry in ninth grade (earn required number of credits; pass proficiency/Ohio Graduation Tests, unless exempted from testing)
<b>Application/ Enrollment Requirements</b>	No minimum number of high school credits required to enroll; however, students have two consecutive years to earn credits needed based on their ninth grade cohort	No minimum number of high school credits required to enroll	All test-takers must apply online through one of the testing vendor websites. All test-takers must be Ohio residents, officially withdrawn from school and at least 18 years of age. A person who is 16 years of age but less than 18 years of age must be officially withdrawn from school and have written approval from the person's parent or guardian or a court official	Applicant has earned at least one-half but not more than six equivalent adult high school credits
<b>Duration</b>	Maximum of two consecutive years to complete the program	Determined by length of credential program	There is no time limit to complete the testing	There is no time limit to complete the program
<b>Additional Requirements</b>	No additional requirements to pursue postsecondary education	Must complete the program and pursue an industry-recognized credential simultaneously	Assessment accommodation requests must be submitted to the GED or HiSET assessment vendors	No additional requirements
